SB434/HB477 CRIMINAL LAW: Off duty law enforcement officers carrying firearms into certain locations.

Sponsors: Sen. Rose, Paul , Rep. White, Mark

Summary: Clarifies that a law enforcement officer is not prohibited from carrying a firearm into certain locations regardless of whether the officer is on or off duty. Clarifies that the

exemption to the ban on weapons in parks and other similar places for a law enforcement officer applies regardless of whether the officer is on duty. Requires signage in

such places to state, "All law enforcement officers are exempt."

Comment: The TN Supreme Court has held that off duty officers are not special classes of citizens but are simply citizens when not engaged in the official discharge of duties. TFA

would prefer to see this bill amended to make clear that those citizens who have the "enhanced permits" are at a minimum given the same scope to carry that other citizens

- who happen to be law enforcement officers when "on the job" - have.

SB946/HB1321 CRIMINAL LAW: Reckless endangerment definition and punishment.

Sponsors: Sen. Kyle, Sara , Rep. Hardaway, G.A.

Summary: Specifies that the offense of reckless endangerment applies to actions committed by multiple people as well as individuals. Establishes that motor vehicles are deadly

weapons for the purpose of reckless endangerment. Specifies that reckless endangerment in a group of two or more people, from within a motor vehicle or into a motor vehicle is a class C felony that is punishable by the revocation of the person's driver's license for five years. Allows the court to sentence someone guilty of reckless endangerment with a deadly weapon to anger management classes. Establishes a sentence enhancement for acts of reckless endangerment found to be acts of community terrorism. Defines "community terrorism" as an offense committed against a population by members of a criminal gang that regularly engages in gang-related conduct.

House Criminal Justice Subcommittee amendment 1 (007434) removes discharging a firearm from within a vehicle from the definition of "reckless endangerment." Adds language allowing persons whose driver's licenses have been revoked or issuance prohibited to apply for a restricted driver's license upon release from confinement.

Removes language regarding the offense of community terrorism.

Requires law enforcement agencies to provide the department of health with incident-level data on shootings that occur within the agency's jurisdiction in order to identify and track hotspots and direct resources where needed. Encourages the department of labor and workforce development to create a youth employment program that includes training on the skills needed for employment, including nonviolent conflict resolution. Requires the

department of safety to develop a firearm buyback program in collaboration with local community groups.
