Permits a retired law enforcement officer, who is authorized to carry a firearm within this state to the same extent as authorized for an active law enforcement officer, to direct or regulate traffic if the chief law enforcement officer in the jurisdiction where the retired officer will be directing or regulating traffic has been notified at least 24 hours in advance, or as soon as possible in the event of an emergency. HB2521 CRIMINAL LAW: Prohibition of weapons at certain meetings. Revises various provisions governing the prohibition or restriction of weapons at meetings or on property owned by a private or government entity, including eliminating the prohibitions a local government can place on possession of a handgun in certain



locations such as libraries, child care agencies, buildings containing a law enforcement agency, and facilities that administer a Head Start program. Requires prohibition notices to be displayed in a prominent location and outlines requirements for wording, graphics, font size and other details. Requires the person or entity responsible for posting the prohibition notice to give a written notice and verbal instructions to suspected violators and provide applicable remedies for the removal of the firearm from the building. Removes the limitation of the concealed carry restriction to only persons with an enhanced handgun carry permit.

Amendment Summary: House Civil Justice Committee amendment 1 (014284) extends the validity of an enhanced handgun carry permit to the lifetime of the permit holder. Eliminates the current lifetime enhanced handgun permit. Authorizes a current enhanced handgun permit holder that expires on or after July 1, 2022, to submit the permit to the Department of Safety (DOS) in exchange for a replacement permit that does not include an expiration date. Authorizes the DOS to charge a fee of \$50 for such replacement permits.

CRIMINAL LAW: Lowers age requirement for handgun carry permit. Allows persons 18 years of age or older to obtain an enhanced or concealed handgun carry permit or lawfully carry a handgun in public, provided the person is not prohibited from possessing a firearm in this state or any other state and meets all other statutory requirements. Prohibits persons under age 21 from transporting or storing a firearm or ammunition in a motor vehicle in a parking area located on any school campus unless

that person is at least 18 years of age and is an honorably discharged or retired veteran of the United States armed forces, including any guard or reserve component.
