# WHAT'S IN THE FOLLOW THE MONEY REPORT AND WHERE DID THE DATA COME FROM?

The Tennessee Conservative's *Follow the Money Report* provides a snapshot of the contributors for some of Tennessee's highest-ranking lawmakers.

We chose to focus on Republicans, since they hold the supermajority in the General Assembly.

Starting with Governor Lee, we worked our way down through the Lieutenant Governor, who also functions as the Speaker of the Senate, the Speaker of the House and the Republican Majority leaders in both the Senate and the House.

We then focused our efforts on the chairs of many of the key Committees and Subcommittees in both chambers. We chose these individuals because their sphere of influence goes beyond a singular vote for any given piece of legislation.

The contribution data used came directly from reports submitted by the elected officials and presented on the state's campaign election finance website.

The real work came in when attempting to decipher the reports to categorize the contributors and organize the information in an easy-to-understand format.

While a donation from any given source does not necessarily equal the elected officials voting for legislation in their favor, one must ask the question, "Why would a donation be given if something isn't received in return?" Many have said that a donation by any specific party is the equivalent of an endorsement.

For all lawmakers, we have highlighted how much funding is coming from their specific districts in comparison to outside their districts. Since Governor Bill Lee's *district* is the whole state, this section was replaced by In-State and Out-of-State contributions for his report.

We believe the vast majority of elected officials' donations should come from their own districts as those are the people that elected them and they should be working for the best interests of those people first and foremost.



### **DEFINITIONS YOU'LL SEE IN THE REPORT:**

#### **CATEGORIES**

A broad heading under which all donations of a specific interest can be placed. For example, the "Healthcare" heading includes special interests ranging from Doctors to Hospitals to Pharmaceuticals. The "Individuals" category refers to an individual person who contributed with no specific interest defined and cannot be determined.

For a breakdown of each contribution, view the full report for each elected official linked in the summaries.

Note: "Corporate" category refers to companies with locations, etc. outside the state of Tennessee. Even if a company/business has multiple locations within the state, they are not categorized as "corporate" because they are solely Tennessee-based.

#### IN-DISTRICT/OUTSIDE-DISTRICT CONTRIBUTIONS

Denotes whether contributions came from within the elected official's district or areas beyond.

#### CONTRIBUTIONS

Donations received from various parties/groups to support the elected official's efforts and/or campaigns.

#### **PAC CONTRIBUTIONS**

Donations received from Political Action Committees.

#### **POTENTIAL CONFLICTS**

This is a judgment call. Contributors were looked at and compared to the committees/spheres of extended influence of lawmakers and a determination was made whether said funding could directly influence matters focused on in said committees, etc.

#### **DISCLAIMER**

As mentioned above, contributions made by a specific individual or entity do not necessarily equal influence over the lawmaker. To determine whether the funding has potentially influenced their votes, one must look at their voting records.

This report was compiled to the very best of our ability. The information provided in the state campaign finance reports was, in almost every case, lacking in detail. Much information was presented in a convoluted fashion that required a great deal of research to unravel. In some cases, the category under which a specific contributor was to be categorized was exceedingly difficult to determine due to phantom organization names or organizational contributions hidden under an individual's personal name. While, almost without a doubt, we missed some things, the outcome of the reports should not be affected by any potential minor errors.
